ENVIRONMENTAL, SAFETY, AND HEALTH (ESH) POLICY STATEMENT

As Commanding Officer of Mid-Atlantic Regional Maintenance Center, it is my policy that no evolution or project commences if it cannot be accomplished safely. As professionals, we are responsible for managing risk in all tasks while leaders at all levels are responsible for ensuring proper procedures are in place and resources are available for their personnel to perform assigned tasks.


Safety policies and Operational/Off-Duty Risk Management (ORM) shall be used to establish and maintain a safety culture that requires everyone's commitment. ORM reduces or offsets risks by systematically identifying hazards and assessing and controlling the associated risks allowing decisions to be made that weigh risks against mission or task benefits. The most common cause of task degradation or mission failure is human error.

All hands must enforce Safety standards and monitor their work environment to identify and promptly correct unsafe and unhealthful conditions. Under no circumstance will an employee experience any form of adverse action for exercising the right to participate in the Safety Program. Supervisors need to ensure that the pressure to "get the job done" does not influence personnel to take short cuts that compromise established safe work practices.

The Environmental, Safety and Health (ESH) or "Safety" Department is located in Building LF-18 and is available to assist Department Heads, managers, supervisors, and employees in maintaining a safe and healthy environment, and off-duty safety.
