Ground Rules

- The purpose of this briefing is to continue our engagement with Industry and to discuss the Navy's plans to maximize Small Business Opportunities within SEA21's Non-Nuclear Surface Ship Maintenance, Repair & Modernization Execution Contracting Strategy.**
- The information provided represents the Navy's intentions, but is not final and is therefore to be considered draft and entirely non-binding. This presentation does not constitute a Request for Proposal (RFP) nor a commitment on behalf of the Navy of any kind.**

- SEA21's Non-Nuclear Surface Maintenance & Modernization Small Business Workload includes all Non-Nuclear surface ship classes except for LCS. SEA21's intentions for Small Businesses include:
 - Set aside Non Complex Maintenance (~20% of Shipyard Scope)
 - RFPs to be released in Norfolk & San Diego in near term.
 - Mayport, Pacific Northwest & Pearl Harbor set aside decisions are under review and will be determined based on individual port's requirements & Industrial base
 - Complex Maintenance & Modernization to maximize Small Business Subcontracting Opportunities
 - Precise goals to be determined based on market research



The Multi Ship Multi Option (MSMO) contracting strategy included a goal for 40% of all production work to be subcontracted to small businesses in order to provide small businesses an opportunity to grow and develop. The Navy intends to maintain and expand the amount and quality of work allocated to small business by:

Expanding the number of contracts set aside for small businesses, representing ~20% of Shipyard Scope

- Norfolk Non-Complex MAC-IDIQ contracts will be awarded to at least 2 technically qualified Primes in the Norfolk Homeport area
- Navy will solicit each availability's actual work packages as Delivery Orders (DOs) under the Non-Complex MAC-IDIQ contracts.
- Non-Complex MAC-IDIQ provides a high degree of flexibility to support competitive/sole source and fixed price DOs
 - Availabilities will be competed as FFP DOs to the greatest extent practicable.
 - Urgent requirements may be directed on sole source firm fixed price basis.

Continuing the inclusion of small business subcontracting goals in contracts solicited under full and open competition.

- Solicitations awarded on a full and open competitive basis will include meaningful small business subcontracting goals (~20%) based on:
 - Historical small business subcontracting metrics,
 - Small business capabilities, and
 - Complexity and magnitude of the Government's requirements
