THE ASSOCIATION

The Association of Scientists & Engineers is a professional organization composed of Civilian Engineers, Scientists and Naval Officers employed by the Naval Sea Systems Command. The aims of the Association are:

1. To promote & protect the best interests of the United States.
2. To promote professional development of its members.
3. To maintain high standards of professional ethics and competence.
4. To foster a spirit of good fellowship and cooperation.

WHAT ASE DOES FOR YOU

The Association provides an important means for professional expression. In addition, it represents the membership as a whole and provides opinions and recommendations on issues which affect the civilian naval engineer and scientist. We are asked annually to review the Federal pay system and our response has been made an enclosure of the memorandum for the President of the United States. We have provided testimony to Congress both directly and indirectly on various problems and situations which are of concern to the membership, e.g., compressed work schedules, reorganization plans, parking problems, working environment, and career development.

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

- 1946 The first formal meeting of the Association of Senior Engineers of the Bureau of Ships.
- 1947 Participated in career development plans for civilian professionals.
- 1964 First Annual Technical Symposium of the Association.
- 1971 Silver Anniversary Year: 25 years of growth, development and service of the Association.
- 1971 First joint technical meeting with other Navy technical organizations (ANWES, ASNE and PANNEES) in the Washington, DC area.

- 1975 Merged with ANWES to become the Association of Scientists and Engineers.
- 1981 Membership soars close to 600.
- 1988 Twenty-Fifth Annual Technical Symposium.
- 1993 Opens membership to field activity chapters.
- 1998 Celebrates 50th Anniversary.
- 1998 Lead Celebration of National Engineers Week for NAVSEA.

ACTIVITIES

- The ASE Technical Symposium, the highlight of ASE activities, is held annually. At the Symposium the members present their technical papers to audiences of both government and industrial representatives of the naval engineering community. Awards are presented at the Symposium banquet in recognition of the best paper, of technical accomplishments, and service to the Association, and a prominent speaker gives an address.
- The monthly Professional Forum Series is held during the noon hours and provides the opportunity to hear guest speakers on subjects of current interest.
- Special events such as field trips to nearby places of interest and joint meetings with other professional societies are held at various times throughout the year.
- The Association presents Science Fair Awards to participants of metropolitan area school science fairs, recognizing outstanding exhibits that apply to science and engineering disciplines to naval applications.
- ASE sponsors participation of co-op students in the annual Washington area engineers & architects seminar.
- “Meet the Chief” meetings provide a forum for members to discuss items of concern with NAVSEA’s senior managers.
- The Scientist & Engineer is the official publication of the Association and is issued several times a year to keep members informed of ASE programs and activities.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

To qualify as a member an applicant must be a civilian employee of, or a Naval Officer assigned to, the Naval Sea Systems Command who is a GS-5 or over and satisfies one of the following:

1. A professional engineer registered in a state of the United States or the District of Columbia.
2. A person employed in a civil service general schedule (GS or GM) Engineering (series 800), Physical Science (series 1300), or Math and Statistics (series 1500).
3. A person holding a Bachelor’s Degree or equivalent from an accredited college or university in one of the following: Engineering, Naval Architecture, Physical Science, Mathematics, Statistics or Computer Science.
4. A member of the Department of the Navy Acquisition Workforce in one or the following career fields: Program Management, Manufacturing and Production, Quality Assurance, Acquisition Logistics, Communication-Computer Systems, Systems Planning, Research and Development and Engineering, or Test and Evaluation Engineering.

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

- Applicants must be sponsored by a member in good standing.
- Annual dues: \$12.00; three year membership is \$30.00; a lifetime membership is \$135.00.
- The Association’s dues year is from 1 July-30 June. The application of dues is as follows:
- New Members – If application is received 1 March-30 June, dues apply through the remainder of the dues year in which paid and the following dues year.
- If application is received 1 July-29 February, dues apply only through remainder of the dues year in which paid.
- Reinstated Members – all dues paid apply to the dues year in which paid only.
- Chairperson, Membership Committee keeps records of dues payments, and maintains the official mailing list.
