General Information

Introduction

Children of military members attend school in the school district where they reside: Charleston, Dorchester 2, Dorchester 4, or Berkeley. Districts provide a full range of PK-12 educational programs, i.e., Career & Technical Education, traditional academic programs, athletics, classes for gifted students and students with special needs. There is also a wide array of magnet, charter, virtual, and private schools available in the area. School starts in mid- August and ends early June for most schools.

South Carolina Public Schools

Public schools are operated at the county level under the South Carolina Department of Education. Statewide test results, and overall school quality, can vary significantly from school to school within each district. It is recommended you look at the individual report cards, and visit each campus, as you make your housing decision.

New Student Registration

Tips for Changing to a New School

Get an “unofficial” copy of transcripts/records to hand carry. This will help ensure proper placement at the new school in case your official records are delayed. You are authorized to carry this “unofficial” copy under terms of the Military Children’s Interstate Compact referenced on Page 5.

High school students should work with guidance at the receiving school as early as possible. Find out all you can about the courses you are going to sign up for at the new school. Bring a copy of your previous high school course syllabi, or a copy of your textbook’s Table of Contents. Algebra II may cover different material at your new school, don't wait for an unpleasant surprise.

Registration and enrollment are completed online. Upload all required documentation on the district portal. If you know the school you will attend, verify next steps with that school’s registrar. Charter and private schools will have different enrollment policies, so check with them directly.

Early Enrollment/Registration: Act 40 of 2023

“A pupil complies with the residency requirements for school attendance in a school district if a parent or legal guardian of the pupil is *transferred to or is pending transfer to a military installation within this State while on active military duty pursuant to an official military order.*”

- A school district shall accept an application for enrollment and course registration by electronic means for a pupil who meets those requirements. This includes enrollment in a specific school or program within the school district.
- Proof of residency must be provided upon arrival.

Enrollment (Age Requirements/Pre-K)

Children who are five years old on or before 1 September **must** register for kindergarten. Children who are four years old on or before 1 September **may** be eligible for pre-school, but strict guidelines may apply. Contact the school in your attendance zone for available slots and requirements for eligibility to attend. According to South Carolina Law, school-aged children must be transferred/enrolled in school within 10 days of arrival.

Documentation

Provide the following documents to the school at the time of registration:

- Student's Birth Certificate
- Proof of residence (normally two sources)
- Unofficial Copy of school records from previous school if available
- Current Special Education records (IEP/504) if applicable
- Proof of guardianship, if applicable

Immunizations

The Medical Clinics will assist you with proper immunizations for South Carolina. Call: 843-963-6719 for the AB, or 843-794-6850 at the WS. They will assist you with updates and proper documentation of immunizations.

Impact Aid

Since 1950, Congress has provided financial assistance to Local Education Agencies (LEA) through the Impact Aid Program. The purpose is to disburse payments to the LEAs that are financially burdened by Federal activities, including lost property tax revenue due to tax exempt federal property and the increased expenditures due to the enrollment of federally connected children in their district. Those Living in Air Base (AB) Housing

AB Housing is serviced by CCSD. Families may elect to attend [Lambs Elementary](#) or [Hunley Park Elementary](#) (K-5) Middle school students (6-8) are assigned to [Zucker Middle School](#), a science magnet school. [Stall High School](#) (9-12) is a state-of-the-art facility that is demonstrating strong improvement.

Charleston County's Resolution to Accommodate Military Families expands access to K-12 School Options for Military Families providing:

- Extended magnet school application periods for military families arriving outside the normal application deadlines.
- The Military Application provides inbound families an opportunity to apply to three CCSD schools they would like to attend. Transportation to a choice school varies, and assignment depends on space available.
- Applications are submitted directly to the CCSD office as noted on the application. A copy of your orders will be required as well.
- APPLY EARLY ONCE YOU HAVE ORDERS
- YOU MAY APPLY IN THE REGULAR LOTTERY SEASON JANUARY-FEBRUARY

DO NOT APPLY DIRECTLY TO ANY OF THE CHOICE SCHOOLS. Direct questions to the district representative as noted on the military application, or with the School Liaison Office.

CCSD Charter Schools operate their own lottery and wait lists. You can contact them directly for additional information.

Early College/Dual Credit

CCSD schools offer Advanced Placement and Dual Credit programs in the high schools, and the district offers an [Early College High School](#) campus. Students can earn college credits, and "potentially" an associate degree upon graduation from high school. Contact the high school or district offices for more specific information.

Berkeley County School District (BCSD)

Berkeley County School district is located slightly north of the Air Base and is home to the JB Charleston Weapons Station. It provides K-12 education for more than 40,000+ students at 48 schools. The county is undergoing massive growth, and there is a wide range of housing and educational opportunities.

Those Living in Weapons Station (WS) Base Housing

WS housing is serviced by Berkeley County Schools. [Marrington Elementary School](#) serves grades Kindergarten to 5th grade. There is a full day 4-year-old program for families that meet the household income criteria. [Marrington Middle School of the Arts](#) is an arts-infused magnet school for grades 6-8. The school has been awarded the National Blue- Ribbon Award and a Palmetto's Finest designation. [Goose Creek High School](#) and the [Berkeley Center for the Arts](#) provide a comprehensive 9-12 curriculum.

Active Duty Residing in Berkeley County

A special provision allows "Active Duty" military families, attached to Joint Base Charleston, residing in Berkeley County, to enroll their school age children at the Marrington Schools on the Weapons Station. Transportation is ONLY provided for eligible base residents.

Dual Credit

[Rollings Middle School of the Arts](#) provides an art infused magnet program for grades 6-12. Application and enrollment information is available from the district. There are no special provisions for military families currently.

Early College/Dual Credit

DD2 offers Advanced Placement and Dual Credit opportunities in high schools. Early College high school programming is available within individual high schools. Students can earn college credits, and “potentially” an associate degree, upon graduation from high school. Contact the high school or district offices for more specific information.

Dorchester School District 4 (DD4)

Dorchester School District 4 (DD4) is the smallest of the four county public school systems. Located in the heart of St. George, South Carolina, and proudly serves approximately 2,200 students across six schools, including three elementary schools, one middle school, one high school, and one alternative education center.

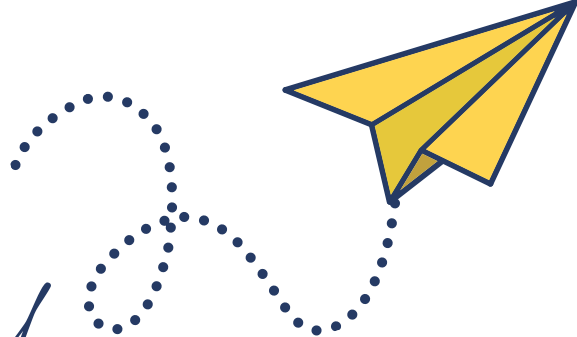

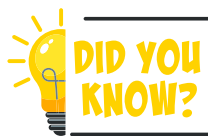

PRE-K THROUGH 12 EDUCATION STATE MILITARY PROVISIONS

**Check with your gaining installation School Liaison for state or country specific guidance*

Advance Enrollment - initiative that allows parents to enroll their children in public school based on military orders as opposed to traditional means of establishing residency, thus, allowing enrollment to occur before the family has moved to the new duty station.

Open Enrollment - Open enrollment is a form of K-12 public school choice that allows students to attend a different school than the one to which they are assigned based on their place of residence. Most states have one or more policies providing for varying degrees of open enrollment, but they can differ greatly across state and even district lines.

School Choice - School choice allows public education funds to follow students to the schools or services that best fit their needs - whether that's to a public school, private school, charter school, home school or any other learning environment families choose.

Military Student Identifier - This designation is used in education to identify students with active-duty parents in the U.S. Armed Forces, National Guard, or Reserves. This identification helps schools understand and address the unique academic needs and challenges these students face, allowing for targeted support.

Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) Non-DoD Schools Program (NDSP)

- If you are currently overseas and enrolled in a DoDEA NDSP School – it is recommended that you request a translated transcript for your student. This service can be coordinated through NDSP and is paid for by NDSP if within your yearly funding allotment.
- It is recommended that you obtain a duplicate transcript that will transfer correctly into the U.S. public school system – This will be particularly important if your student is in middle or high school.

Many parents who home school in South Carolina choose Option 3 because it allows more flexibility, particularly in the area of curriculum selection. Option 3 requires affiliation with an accountability association. This organization provides a means of legal compliance for its members under SC home school statutes 59-65-45 (SCAIHS) and 59-65-47 (all others). MFLC's offer short-term non-medical counseling services to children, parents, faculty, and staff. The MFLC's interface with military students in small group sessions as well as individual sessions. The MFLC counselors are at the schools to help and are available to talk to military students, facilitate group activities, outreach to parents and to process interactions and concerns, such as:

- Communication
- Self-esteem/self-confidence
- Resolving conflicts
- Behavioral management techniques
- Bullying
- Helping children deal with angry feelings

FAQ on Impact Aid For Parents

1. What is Impact Aid?

Impact Aid is a Federal education program that reimburses school districts for the lost revenue and additional costs associated with the presence of nontaxable Federal property, such as military installations; Indian Trust or Treaty lands; Federal low-rent housing facilities; and national laboratories, national parks and other Federal buildings or lands. There are more than 1,200 federally impacted school districts (those districts that receive Impact Aid) located across all 50 states. Together, they educate more than 10 million public school students.

2. How are federally impacted school districts different from other public school districts?

Most public school districts are funded in large part by local revenue – primarily a combination of local property taxes on homes and businesses or other local fees. School financing is limited for federally impacted school districts because Federal property – and housing, businesses, and other facilities located on Federal property – are tax exempt. This means that, unlike other types of property, the Federal government's land does not contribute to the costs of running a school district.

3. Who are federally connected students?

Federally connected students are those who have a parent or guardian on active duty in the military; live on Indian lands, in Federal low-income housing or other federally owned property; or live with a parent or guardian who works on Federal property. More than 80 percent of military-connected and American Indian students attend public schools. A school district can receive Impact Aid funding if it has at least 400 federally connected students in its Average Daily Attendance (ADA), or at least 3% of all children in its ADA are federally connected. The number and percentage of federally connected students in a district is a critical factor in determining how much Impact Aid funding that district receives.

4. Why is Impact Aid directed toward the school district and not individual families, schools or Tribes?

Impact Aid takes the place of revenue that a community would otherwise generate through property, income and sales taxes. Therefore, it goes into a school district's operating fund and is used to support *all* students in the district, just like other local tax revenue.

5. How do school districts use Impact Aid funds?

Impact Aid can be used for any general fund purpose, such as instructional materials, teacher salaries, transportation, technology, social-emotional supports or facilities. All decisions on how Impact Aid funds are spent are made locally. This flexibility and local control allows school district leaders to target funds supporting all students wherever the needs are greatest.

6. What information does the school district need to collect from parents, and why?

For a school district to receive Impact Aid, the Federal government requires it to collect specific information to verify its federally connected students. For each student, this information includes both enrollment information (such as name, birth date and school) and residence and parent employment information (including, but not limited to, student address if on Federal property; name and address of the Federal property on which a parent is employed; and name, rank and branch of service of a parent who is a member of the uniformed services on active duty). The form must be signed and dated by the parent supplying the information.

7. How is this information shared and protected?

Information on the form is used only for purposes of submitting the Impact Aid application. It is subject to a school district's student privacy policy, as well as Federal and state laws protecting the privacy of students and families.

8. Why do I have to complete these forms every year?

Since enrollment changes from year to year, the Federal government requires school districts to count students every year before it allocates Impact Aid funding. It is critical that survey forms are filled out completely and signed, or the student may not be recognized as federally connected (which means less money for the school district!).

9. Does my school district receive all the Impact Aid funding it is due?

No. Funding must be approved annually by Congress. Because of limited Federal funding and competing interests, Impact Aid has not been fully funded since 1969. On average, school districts receive about 55% of what they're due.

10. How much of my school district's budget is made up of Impact Aid?

It depends on your community and its level of impaction. Impact Aid funding can range from a fraction of a percent to more than 50 percent of a school district's budget, as some federally impacted school districts are located entirely on Federal property or have as few as three taxpayers.

11. What can I do to support Impact Aid?

Be sure to complete all Impact Aid survey forms in their entirety to ensure it gets the funding it deserves. If you hear other parents questioning why they need to fill out the forms, let them know how important it is to their local school.
