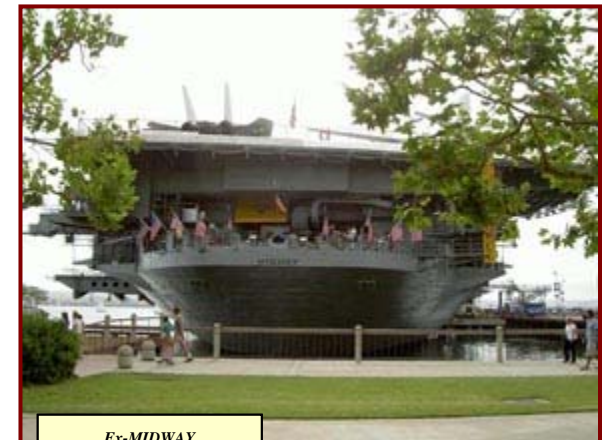

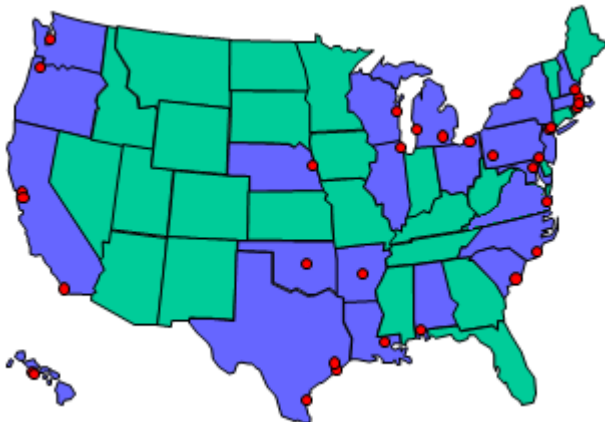

NAVY SHIP DONATIONS

For more than sixty years, the Navy has donated historic and other ships as museums and memorials pursuant to the ship donation statute, Title 10 USC 7306. Transfers are at no cost to the U.S. government. The Donee assumes title and all ownership costs of restoration, preservation, maintenance, operation as a static ship museum for public display, periodic dry-docking, and ultimately ship disposal. There are currently 48 museum ships donated by the U.S. Navy located in 23 states. A significant challenge for ship museums is the responsibility for preservation of underwater hulls of water-born vessels.

SHIP DONATION INSPECTION PROGRAM

The Ship Donation Inspection Program utilizes Engineering Duty Officers of the naval reserve to annually inspect the material condition of donated ships to ensure compliance with the donation transfer contract, including the statutory requirement that the donated vessels be maintained in a condition satisfactory to the Secretary of the Navy. This includes determining if the Donee has adequate procedures in place to preserve the vessel against rust and corrosion that threaten the long-term integrity of the vessel.

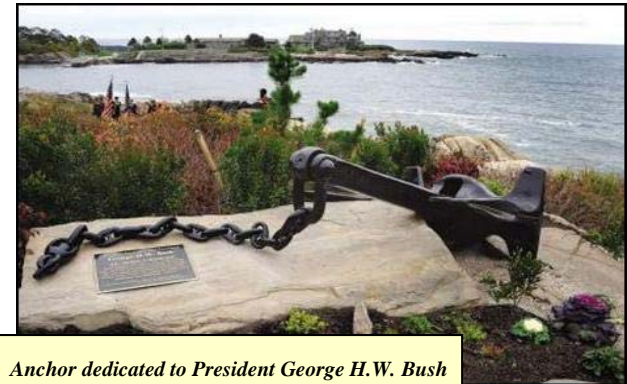

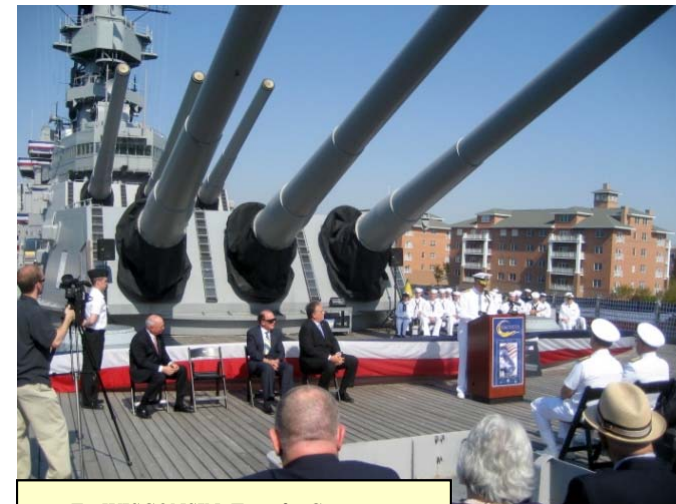
MATERIAL DONATIONS

*Navy Material Donation Statute
Title 10 USC 2572 and 7545*

The Navy Inactive Ships Program facilitates the donation, to eligible recipients, of excess material from vessels stricken from the Naval Vessel Register and located in the Navy's inactive ship inventory. Donation of other Navy material is facilitated by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Disposition Services.
