,	In 1985, during OPERATION BEAR HUNT 85- ST. LOUIS offloaded in Pusan, Korea, 2810 personnel, 1779 vehicles, 4808 pallets (including 190 landing force magazine pallets). Also offloaded was 190 outsized cargo vehicles and two Marine rotary – winged aircraft carried on the flight deck. In 1991, ST. LOUIS loaded 28 reverse osmosis water purification units (ROWPUs) each weighing more than 5 tons for use in the relief effort of Operation Sea Angel. ST. LOUIS than departed Okinawa, arrived 10 days later off the coast of Chittagong, Bangladesh to support Operation Sea Angel. Also in 1991, ST. LOUIS provided humanitarian assistance to the naval base in Subic Bay, Philippines and nearby Cubi Point Naval Air Station during Operation Fiery Vigil after the volcanic eruption of Mount Pinatubo, followed by several days of torrential rains and severe earthquakes.
