Noteworthy Events	USNS Shughart (T-AKR 295), is a United States Navy container roll-on roll-off cargo vessel. She was delivered in 1980 for the A.P. Moller-Maersk, Lindovaerftet Shipyard as the MV Laura Maersk. The US Navy acquired her in 1990's, and she was converted to a medium speed roll on roll off ship at National Steel and Shipbuilding in California. The Shughart was placed into non-commissioned service with Military Sealift Command on 7 May 1996. Namesake of the ship is Sergeant First Class Randall Shughart who was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for service in Mogadishu, Somalia. The Shughart is assigned to the Atlantic Fleet of Military Sealift Command and stationed in Newport News, Virginia.
