<b>Deployment Summary</b>	<p>From September to December 2020, Sioux City deployed to Caribbean for a counter-narcotics mission along with Coast Guard Law Enforcement Detachment 104. It deployed to the Caribbean for another counter-narcotics mission, this time with Coast Guard Law Enforcement Team 102 from September to December 2021. May 2022, in a historic moment for the region, a Freedom-variant littoral combat ship, USS Sioux City (LCS 11), deployed to U.S. Sixth Fleet's area of operations, supporting U.S. and NATO Ally and Partner interests in Europe and Africa.</p> <p>The Freedom-variant littoral combat ship USS Sioux City (LCS 11) returned to Naval Station Mayport, Florida, October 2, 2022, following its historic five-month deployment to the U.S. 5th and 6th Fleet areas of operations.</p>
<b>Awards</b>	N/A
<b>Noteworthy Events</b>	<p>In September 2020, Sioux City was assigned to the US Southern Command with a United States Coast Guard law enforcement detachment on board to help perform counter-narcotics operations.</p> <p>Sioux City leads a joint flotilla through the Persian Gulf, June 2022</p> <p>In May 2022, Sioux City was assigned to the Sixth Fleet, while she was equipped with a surface warfare module. In late May, Sioux City was re-assigned to the Fifth Fleet and assigned to the Combined Task Force (CTF) 153 in the Red Sea.</p> <p>On 14 August 2023, Sioux City was decommissioned at Naval Station Mayport.</p>
