<b>Deployment Summary</b>	From September to December 2020, Sioux City deployed to Caribbean for a counter-narcotics mission along with Coast Guard Law Enforcement Detachment 104. It deployed to the Caribbean for another counternarcotics mission, this time with Coast Guard Law Enforcement Team 102 from September to December 2021. May 2022, in a historic moment for the region, a Freedom-variant littoral combat ship, USS Sioux City (LCS 11), deployed to U.S. Sixth Fleet's area of operations, supporting U.S. and NATO Ally and Partner interests in Europe and Africa.  The Freedom-variant littoral combat ship USS Sioux City (LCS 11) returned to Naval Station Mayport, Florida, October 2, 2022, following its historic five-month deployment to the U.S. 5th and 6th Fleet areas of operations.

Noteworthy Events	In September 2020, Sioux City was assigned to the US Southern Command with a United States Coast Guard law enforcement detachment on board to help perform counter-narcotics operations.  Sioux City leads a joint flotilla through the Persian Gulf, June 2022  In May 2022, Sioux City was assigned to the Sixth Fleet, while she was equipped with a surface warfare module. In late May, Sioux City was reassigned to the Fifth Fleet and assigned to the Combined Task Force (CTF) 153 in the Red Sea.  On 14 August 2023, Sioux City was decommissioned at Naval Station Mayport.
